**POLICY**

Tuition and Registration fee is due by the first lesson or class. **Materials Fee** must accompany the Registration for Kindermusik classes. **Two weeks advance payment ensures that Materials will arrive in time for the first class.** Please make checks payable to "School of Creative Arts" or "SCA" and mail with registration forms to: School of Creative Arts, P.O. Please note that there is a \$25 fee for returned checks.

If a **payment plan** is needed you must request one from the SCA director, Nancy Gerber, before classes or private lessons begin.

Your **additional financial contributions to SCA** are tax-deductible and help families with limited means take our classes.

**Some financial aid is available.** You may request a financial aid application by calling: 781-272-1014 x 180.

**Discounts:** You may take a \$20 discount for each sibling who registers for a class. (This does not apply to Family Time, which has its own built-in discount). You may also take a \$10 discount for each student you refer to SCA who registers for a Kindermusik or Theatre class.

**Reimbursement policy:** Registration fees are non-refundable. Withdrawal before first class refunded 100%. Before second class refunded 75%. **No refunds after the second class.**

*Kindermusik Village* is a special bonding time between lap baby/ crawler/ toddler/ and parent/caregiver in a delightful interplay of movement, singing, vocal play, and exploration of sounds, textures and simple instruments. You'll also enjoy Kindermusik Village as a community-building class! These units contain hallmark variety, including upbeat activities, an array of intimate lullabies, and lots of stimulating and age-appropriate objects and instruments for Baby to explore. Village incorporates the most current research on early childhood development and provides families a special place for learning and connecting with other parents and babies through music and movement.

**Cock-a-doodle-Moo!** -- Hop on the hayride—it's time to head for the farm! Sing songs about animals, engage in playful activities with your baby, including lap bounces, movement, and quiet time/listening. **Home Materials:** A picture board book with charming farm animals and the sounds they make—*Cock-a-doodle-Moo*, a CD of the songs heard in class, a Sunshine Jingle instrument for music-making at home, and a set of Art Banners for the nursery wall.

**Dew Drops** -- Stop and smell the roses—and lily of the valley, and tulips, and pansies. In this class, parents and babies will play and move together to songs about flowers, such as "Jasmine Flower," "How Does Your Garden Grow?" and "White Coral Bells." You'll also hear traditional Irish music, dance a jig and move to the "Irish Trot." **Home Materials:** CD of beautifully arranged songs from class, a board book of colorful flowers, a set of Art Banners for the nursery wall, and a Flower Bells instrument for music-making at home.

Our Time reflects the emotional foundations of school readiness and the latest research on music and early childhood development. *Our Time* is a unique opportunity for parent and child to interact and learn together in an unhurried and joyful manner.

**Away We Go!** -- Hop on the train, get in the car, board the plane, and Away We Go! This class focuses on transportation, a favorite topic for toddlers who are on the go, go, go! Sing and play along with favorite songs, such as "I've Been Workin' on the Railroad" and "Wheels on the Bus". Explore fast and slow, smooth and bumpy, and high and low. Read stories about ways to get around. Shiny Dinah tells the story of a train, and Giddy-Up! has a horse, speedboat, racecar, and more to help you get where you want to go. **Home Materials:** Double CD featuring songs from class; two interactive story books—*Shiny Dinah* and *Giddy-Up!* to develop early literacy skills; Home Activity Book, and two harmonicas designed for toddlers.

Imagine That! is designed for active, energetic, enthusiastic, and imaginative children ages 3 to 5. The classes encourage socialization, sharing, and participating in group activities.

**Toys I Make, Trips I Take** -- We'll use the theme of a toy shop to make our pretend-creations, using rhythm and songs with every imaginary saw, hammer, and nail. The result is building the preschooler's sense of a sequence of events, which is good for storytelling, as well as making his ideas a reality. Home Materials: Two books—*If I Had a Big Blue Boat* and *Tippity Tippetty Too*, a Play Set, Two Home CDs, Family Activity Book, and a drum.

Kindermusik for the Young Child provides a low-pressure, developmentally appropriate transition to musically succeed before taking on more formal instruction. While we plant the seeds of learning through music in the classroom, your joyful homework time together will cultivate lifelong learning. The program is sequential, taking four semesters to complete, exploring voice development, rhythm, notation, musical symbols, authentic pre-keyboard, string and woodwind instruments, and multi-cultural songs and dances. Parents and siblings join for the last 10 minutes to review the class and receive the homework which the student will do with an adult partner at home.

**Semester Two** -- Playing simple musical patterns and songs on the featured instrument from the first session—the glockenspiel—is a central focus this semester. While learning to sing a melody, and then play the pattern on the glockenspiel, we'll delve deeper into the understanding of musical concepts such as piano and forte through orchestra-style music such as the William Tell Overture and Peter and the Wolf. Music appreciation and understanding continues with a complete introduction to the instruments—and the families in which they're grouped—of the orchestra. **Home Materials:** Children's Folder with stickers, games bag, and Music At Home Cards, Family Songbook, and Home CD of music from class.
